The Dark Side of Blue Light - Jackie O'Keefe- ABO Technical

Our ophthalmic world has been paying closer attention to blue light lately. Whether artificial or from the sun Blue Light can actually cause harm to the human eye and has an effect on our daily rhythms. And with the increase use of electronics like smart phones, tablets and laptops, our exposure to blue light is intensifying. Discover the mysteries of this powerful light and learn how to prevent prolonged exposure for you and your patients.

Advances in Designing GP Lenses - Michael Gzik - NCLE Technical

The participant will be able to evaluate the different types of corneal astigmatism and what strategies are used in correcting each. The astigmatism conditions include but are not limited to. With the rule, against the rule, residual, and irregular, such as post op PKP, PTK, PRK, Lasik and trauma. The lens designs used include but are not limited to spherical, toric, aspheric, reverse geometry GP's.

Polarized Lenses, The Technology and Benefits— Candace O'Keefe Culp — ABO Technical

This one hour course begins with the discovery and nature of polarized light and demonstrates how unpolarized light waves become polarized light. Participants will be introduced to the technology and science behind polarized lenses and visualize the structures of both the polarized film and polarized lens construction. The harmful effects of polarized light will be discussed including the 4 types of glare which affect our eyesight. Realizing the growing need for protective sunwear, we will review ways to communicate these features and benefits while overcoming price sensitivity and other objections.

Soft Contact Lens Fitting, What Could Be Simpler – Michael Gzik – NCLE Technical Single vision contact lenses make up 50% of all soft lens prescribed in the US. Because prescriptions with cylinders of less than -0.75 are considered to be the easiest to fit. Many practitioners "mail in" the lens type prescribed and give out a box of solutions based on nothing more than what is on the shelf at the time. This course is designed to help participant review the strategies used to prescribe a silicone hydrogel, or hydrogel material with appropriate system of disinfection based on patient needs and lifestyle.

Dispensing prescription eyewear is an enjoyable and challenging process. Many times the optician must troubleshoot optical problems quickly and effectively.
