8:00 – 9:00 am	<b>Understanding Photochromic Technology – Shannon Toler – ABO Technical</b> This one hour will describe how photochromic technology works and what environmental factors affect photochromic performance. Photochromic fatigue and common manufacturing methods will also be addressed. The most technical section of the course will be explaining how to interpret a kinetics chart, allowing participants to compare and contrast various lens performances. The importance of the 4 <sup>th</sup> stage – the fade-back stage - to wearer functionality and comfort will be the focus.			
9:00 – 10:00 am	Welcoming Patients to Presbyopia- Pete Hanlin- ABO Technical The average age for a progressive lens wearer is around early to mid 50's. However, patients tend to experience presbyopia in their early 40's. In this training you'll learn how to approach newly presbyopic patients, navigate their misconceptions and guide them towards the best visual solution, progressive lenses.			
10:00 – 11:00 am	Compensated Powers (and other ophthalmic conundrums) – Pete Hanlin– ABO Technical Compensated powers are possibly the most misunderstood feature of modern progressive designs. This course describes why compensation exists and why it does not change the actual ordered power of the lens. Additionally, this course describes the exact optical effect and impact of chromatic aberration, explains how a no-glare surface can actually increase UV exposure, and takes a quick look at the nature of ANSI tolerances.			
11:00 – 12:00 Noon	<b>Tackling Trouble Shooting –</b> <i>Brent McCardle and Jerry Himes</i> – ABO Technical Opticians face problems with patient glasses weekly, the majority of them do not know handle the problems, or what is causing the problems. This course will help them understand and solve most of these problems. It will go thru how to avoid having to troubleshooting, and it will give the student guidelines for troubleshooting. The speaker will go thru common concerns and solutions for troubleshooting.

- 9:00 10:00 am UV vs Blue & Sun Vision –*Brent McCardle and Jerry Himes*–ABO/NCLE Technical UV light is the most harmful challenge to long term eye health. It is always

around and invisible, but the harmful effects are cumulating over time. Many lenses claim to protect against UV, but in reality they do not. Some clear ophthalmic lenses can miss 40% of the harmful UV radiation.

10:00 – 11:00 am Myopia Control Lenses – *Brent McCardle and Jerry Himes* – ABO/NCLE Technical

Patients want to know what their glasses will look like and we spend time discussing that with them. But...how will they see with their glasses? That's an even more important question. Unequal refractive errors not only have an effect on how glasses will look, but how a person sees or even "IF" they see WELL. This course will present answers to these questions presenting both spectacle and contact lens options in the discussion.

## 11:00 – 12:00 noon Prism – Brent McCardle and Jerry Himes – ABO/NCLE Technical

Opticians face prism daily. However the majority of them do not understand, do not know how to deal with it, of know how to solve the problem. This course will help them understand most aspects of prism.
